



Fall 2024 Lake Washington Project List

- 1. Beckel Grade Stabilization Project Completed 2023.
- 2. Pilot Water Storage Grant Completed 2024 .
- 3. Page/Meyer Wetland Restoration Completed Fall 2024.
- 4. Baker CRP/Wetlands We are hoping this will start in 2026.
- 5. Hinton Watershed Wetland.
- 6. Le Sueur County Park Wetland Once approved, this project will be installed.
- 7. Schoemaker Wetlands Complete-Installed 5 wetlands in fall of 2022.
- 8. Biehn/Mulvehill Water and Sediment Control Basin Installed 2022.
- 9. McCarthy Water and Sediment Control Basins Basin Installed 2020.
- 10. McCarthy/Beckel Water and Sediment Control Basins Installed 2020/21.

Lakers – Germscheid and Lynch Families

Ted and Lucille Michael bought a family farm and land on the north end of the lake in 1948. This is where Elaine Michael Germscheid, and her sister, Janice Michael Lynch, grew up. Elaine's and Janice's families built cabins along the lakeshore below the farm. The families lived in the cabins every summer from May-September. When Ted and Lucille retired 1977, the farm was separated. Half going to the to the Germscheid family and half to the Lynch family. Since then, the Germscheid's have built lake homes. The Lynch portion remains with cabins. Currently the 5th generation is living on the property. There are 10 Lynch/Germscheid cousins (below). Nine of the 10, and 5 nieces, own properties on the Lake. All together, the families own roughly 20 properties on or around the lake (above).



- **LakeFinder**: An online tool that provides information on over 4,500 lakes and rivers in Minnesota. This includes information on water quality, fishing regulations, lake maps, and more.
- Lake Level Minnesota: A program where volunteers and organizations collect and report lake levels across the state.
- **Minnesota's Lake Superior Coastal Program**: A federal and state partnership that manages coastal resources.
- Water Quality Data and Conditions: Data and conditions from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.
- **Lakes-DB**: A computer database that stores and retrieves information on Minnesota's lakes.
- Lakescaping For Wildlife and Water Quality: A DNR publication that provides information on erosion control methods.
- **Shallow Lakes Program**: A program from the Minnesota DNR.
- **LeSueur County Beacon:** The map function on this website includes satellite images of every lot in the county. The site also includes property owner names, property values, and tax information.

The Lake Washington Club

The boat club was opened in 1927 by the Masonic Lodge. The site included a pavilion, beach, boat slips, and caretaker's cabin. The club remained a Masonic organization until the mid-1970s when it was opened to associate members. The pavilion was lost to a fire in 2005. A new shelter was built in 2006.
